c. Measurement/ Significance / Documentation:

1. Measurement: Show & Tell how you are going to measure your progress during this project. Be sure to show a

- draft Data Table(s),
- draft Graphs,
- list of the Pictures you'll need to take to before & after...
- any other ways you'll need to measure progress

2. Significance: Explain the *significance* of this present to the environment and, **“How will this project help the environment”**

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3. Documentation: Completely describe how you propose to document and present this project:

NOTE: A FINAL PRESENTATION FORMAT IS REQUIRED. Most students use Google Slides or PowerPoint others use iMovie or other ways to show what they've done.

First 3 sections will be (1. Title 2. What my project was about and why I chose it. 3. Background Research you did.) etc.. However, research, photos, iMovie, PowerPoint, utility bills, receipts, signatures etc may also be needed to show your efforts.)

d. Timing: Draw a Timeline of the project phases. T Most projects go for at least a month and a half to two months. Peer Review will be in the second week of March. Final report date will be around the 3rd/4th week in March. (Note, your actual project should be done by the end of the first week of March to allow you enough time for the final report => see below)

e. Resources: Explain / List what resources you will need and help you will need to get this project done *excellently, on time and above standard*. (Examples: Help from others, materials, utility bills, receipts, signatures etc.)

Groups: 2 person group projects are possible, but must be pre approved and written up separately by each individual involved.

Each group of 2 is required to do double the outcome and effort.
